Recent tragedies and our response

At the time of this writing, May 26. Our country was hit with the tragic news of a gunman in Uvalde Texas shot and killed nineteen young children and two teachers at the Robb Elementary School. We are deeply grieved by this tragedy and our continued thoughts and prayers are with the victims, families and the community.

Also at the time of this writing the Southern Baptist Convention was hit with hard news from the independent investigation from Guidepost into mishandling sex abuse allegations. The independent investigation was requested by the messengers at the 2021 Annual Meeting in Nashville, in an effort to call for accountability and demand SBC executive committee to correct its failings of non-reporting and lack of oversight.

Both of these cases are extremely troubling, and measures need to be taken to stop both of these assaults. What does this mean for us in the Laurel River Association? Presently, it means that our church strengthening team will be looking at specific ways to help churches with church security on all fronts. Whether that is protection from assailants or predators, our goal will be to assist churches in planning for those scenarios so that we can protect the most vulnerable in our care. Very soon our Church Strengthening Team will be presenting trainings on church security and helping churches with prevention, response and care as it relates to sexual abuse.
